Classroom Expectations

At Home Expectations

As your student's caregiver, I believe it is your responsibility to take an interest and active role in your child's education. In 5th grade, students are learning to gain a sense of responsibility and independence for their schoolwork and overall education. Therefore, keeping your student accountable for in, and out of class assignments, as well as their behavior while in my classroom, is greatly appreciated. Your student's grades are accessible for you to view through Powerschool using your username and password. I recommend that you sign up for weekly updates regarding any missing, incomplete, or failed assignments. If at any time you are unsure how to help your student or would like an update on your student's academics or behavior, please do no hesitate to contact me via email or phone.

Tutoring

Tutoring will be available for students on who would like extra help in particular subject, topic, or simply want extra practice. After the first quarter, please contact the content teacher for further assistance and guidance.

Canvas

As a fifth grade student it is important to learn how to stay organized and on top of all assignments. This website will be available for students and parents to view upcoming events, classroom reminders, test dates, and other valuable information. Please check this daily for updates.

If your student is tardy they are starting their day feeling rushed and may have additional homework assignments or require detention to make-up this lost class time.

Classroom Economy System

This year students will be participating in a classroom economy system to help prepare them for their JA BizTown Experience. Students will have expenses, earnings, fines, and potential debt all based upon their daily behavior, participation, and classroom achievement. Everyone will also be asked to share in the responsibility of maintaining our classroom by holding a leadership position. Finally, students will be able to spend their money in our classroom store to purchase supplies, small trinkets, homework passes, and more.

Homework Policy

Homework will be given weekly/bi-weekly and is a direct reflection of that week's covered content. It is crucial that students utilize this homework as review and practice. All homework assignments will be given on Monday and are to be completed by the due date. I will look for effort, critical thinking, and completion. Homework could include worksheets, writing assignments, projects, and online assignments. All homework should take around 50 – 60 minutes (10 minutes per grade). Each day an assignment is late, 5 point will be deducted. After 5 school days of not turning in the assignment, the assignment will automatically receive a zero.

Homework MUST be signed by parents to receive full credit on homework. Any unsigned homework will result in an 80% or less depending on effort and completion.

Below is our Homework Policy:

1st – A fine of \$5 and turned in without a late grade within 1 school day.

2nd – Silent lunch in the classroom, late grade, parent contact

3rd – Lunch detention, Late grade, parent contact,

 4^{th} – lunch detention, Grade of zero, parent contact, office referral, ISS to complete the work

Discipline Policy

Students will be responsible for all of their actions and behaviors, both verbal and physical. All students will be treated equally when assessing fines for misbehavior and rewards for showing responsibility. If misbehavior occurs, parents will receive communication via email or phone and a reflection sheet will be sent home for you to sign. Consequences could include, but are not limited to a fine, lunch detention, moving seats, or an after-school detention. If necessary, administration will be involved and a behavior contract will be set in place. All student deserve to learn in a safe and controlled classroom environment, therefore discipline is enforced and rewarded appropriately.
